#### **Project Objective (APSR Nov 2006)**

#### Objective:

To refine the Automatic Obsolescence Notification System (AONS) developed in an earlier stage of APSR, to a platform-independent downloadable tool that automatically provides information from authoritative international registries to support decisions on preservation action required to retain access to information resources stored in repositories.





#### Why AONS II?

Format obsolescence is potentially a major problem for every repository manager. This is particularly true given:

- Ever-increasing volume of digital material
- Plethora of file formats
- Dynamic nature of computing environments
- Rapid and unpredictable drivers that cause formats to become obsolete
- High business value of the specific content of some digital materials or collections can result in policies that mandate that access be maintained to this data for extended periods of time



Repository managers need help to manage the quantity and diversity of file formats and their obsolescence risks.





## High-level Software Design Principles

- Support three different business environments
  - a national federated infrastructure
  - enterprise business models
  - individual standalone repository sites
- Open source & use Java code
- Modular & Reusable/Adaptable
- Platform independent
- Interoperable, using common interfaces, protocols and standards
- RESTful Service-Oriented Architecture
- Loosely-coupled configurable design
- Demonstrable









    - adhoc or scheduled monitoring








## Recognising File Formats and Building Collection Profiles

- Collection profile construction
  - Compliant XML metadata summary
  - Repository crawl using adapters purpose-built for a type of repository
- Crawl result processing
  - Repository-supplied metadata (e.g. from DSpace)
  - Automated format recognition tools (such as DROID, JHOVE or other plug-in tool).







#### **AONS Ten Commandments**

I: Thou shalt not worship proprietary file formats

II: Thou shalt not discard files of wayward format

III: Remember not to analyse file formats manually on the weekend

IV: Honour "base" file formats

V: Thou shalt not kill digital file contents

VI: Thou shalt not commit to a risky file format

VIII: Thou shalt not falsely assess a file format's risk

IX: Thou shalt not covet other format rendering infrastructure

X: Thou shalt not covet supported file formats
