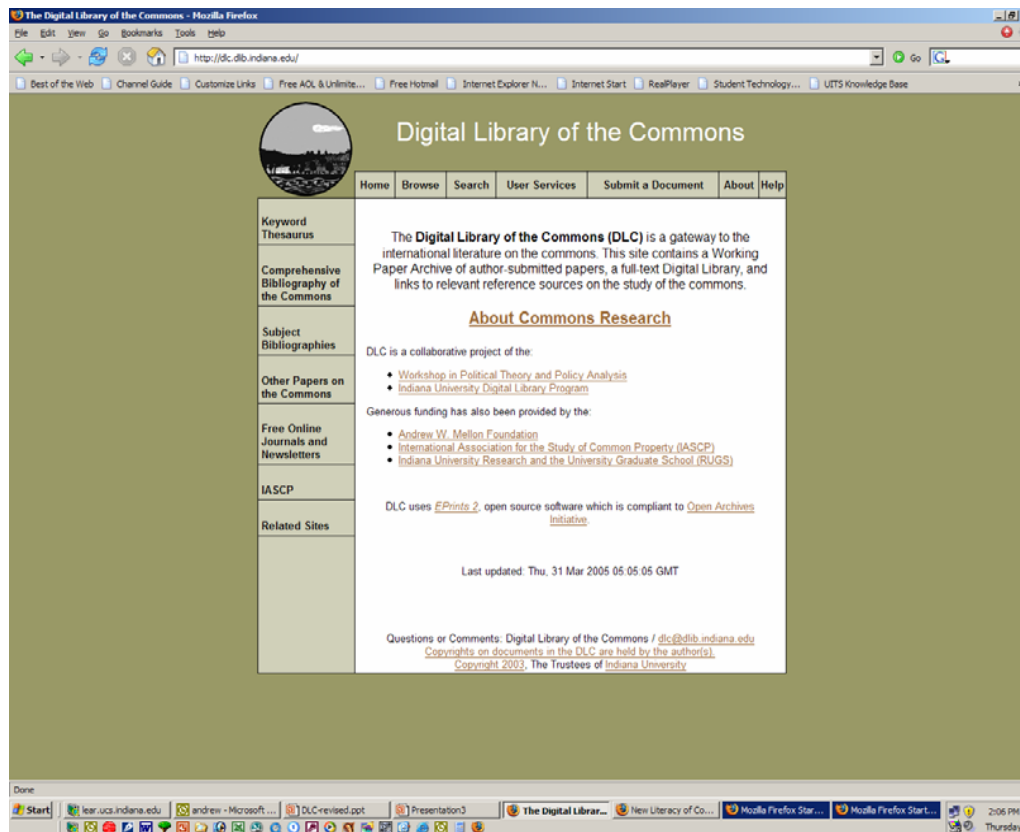

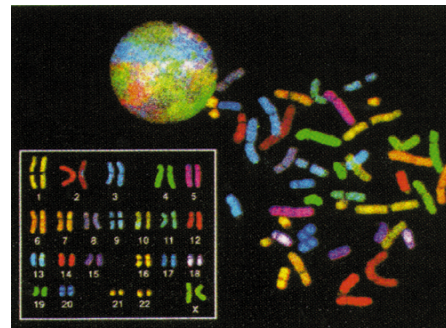
Traditional Commons
